Dear Lifelong Learner,



She recently retired after 20 years with the Smithsonian Associates designing adult study tours. She has had a lifelong fascination with the world's religions which she approaches with openness and from a scholarly perspective. Karen has taught over 30 ILR courses.





ILR551 Ethical Explorations: From the Ancient Greeks to the Present

4 sessions, 10 hours

Without a doubt, our moral code, or lack thereof, is at the heart of our lives, affecting our finances, politics, legal situation, associations and relationships, and even our most life-changing, intimate personal decisions. In this series of lectures, Dr. Karen Gray considers the history and sources of diverse human codes. She'll explore moral philosophy in a way that is intended to assist the students in the understanding and nature of their own moral codes, and the ways in which they interact with those whose codes are sometimes not just different, but in conflict with their own. Dr. Gray's heavily illustrated PowerPoint presentations are two hours long with a 10 minutes break in the middle and half an hour for discussion at the end.

ILR546 The Defiant Requiem

6 sessions, 12 hours

This course tells the little known story of the Nazi concentration camp, Terezin. Led by imprisoned conductor Rafael Schächter, the inmates of Terezín fought back...with art and music. This course will involve viewing a film followed by an in-class discussion. We will also explore other music and artists that reflected social change.

Instructor: Lynn Fleming is currently principal bassist with the National String Symphonia. Additionally, she has conducted a number of orchestras and has participated in the InterHarmony Music Festival in Italy. She is currently the director and conductor of the Frederick Community College String Ensemble. A graduate of the Juilliard School of Music, Ms. Fleming spent ten years teaching and performing in Venezuela with the Maracaibo Symphony Orchestra. Ms. Fleming eventually joined the faculty of the Juilliard School Music Advancement Program where she taught double bass and performed with some of the premier ensembles in NYC and the surrounding area.

ILR559 The Pugilist: Andrew Jackson and His Presidency

6 sessions, 12 hours

This course will cover Jackson's background, including his controversial marriage, personal traits and political philosophy. We'll explore major events of his two-term presidency including the Eaton Affair, the 1832 South Carolina nullification crisis, the Bank of the United States, the "spoils system" and "kitchen cabinet," Indian removal, and the creation of the modern Democratic Party. We'll finish the course with a discussion of the legacy of the "Age of Jackson."

Instructor: Colonial historian Roger G. Swartz received national acclaim for his two books covering the frontiers of the American Revolution. In 2004, he was chosen, along with 2 others, to be the educational coordinator for the 13-day bus tour sponsored by then National Elderhostel program for the 250th anniversary commemoration of the French & Indian War, 1754 – 1763.

ILR563 Equal Protection: The 14th Amendment

6 sessions, 9 hours

This course considers the uniquely American approach to "state action" as it applies to the obligations of the states to provide equal protection to citizens of the United States. These rights are conferred on the citizenry by the Fourteenth Amendment to the Constitution which provides "No State shall make or enforce any law..... (which would) deny to any person within its jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws." We will consider the historical, sociological and political reasons surrounding the adoption of the 14th Amendment and its application over time. We will also consider matters of race, economic and social regulations, age, disability, sexual orientation, gender, marriage, voting, access to courts, and the right to travel.

Instructor: Jim Baer's former students at Ursinus College called him "intelligent, motivating, friendly, very funny, very experienced," and said he was, "the best teacher ever hired." A graduate of The University of Virginia School of Law, Jim is a forty-five year member of the Maryland Bar and was also a member of the Bar of the District of Columbia and the Bar of the Supreme Court of the United States of America. He was a trial lawyer in private practice until 2001 when he returned to his alma mater, Ursinus College, where he created the college's Center for Legal Studies and taught a variety of courses utilizing a unique blend of Socratic Method and open class discussion.

This course will focus on the basic principles of learning, memory and cognition, with a special emphasis on the changes that occur from mid-life through older adulthood. We will also explore specific factors and lifestyle behaviors that could potentially accelerate the aging process, as well as those that may facilitate healthier brain functioning in our later years.

Instructor: Barbara Angleberger has a Master in Counseling Psychology, with 42 years experience in education. She was a counselor with FCPS and served as an adjunct faculty member and Foreign Language Coordinator at FCC before transitioning to a full-time psychology position for 27 yrs. During that time, she chaired the Social Sciences Department. The courses she taught include: General Psychology, Abnormal Psych., Social Psych, Human Growth and Development, and Psych of Adolescence.

ILR581 Quantum Mechanics

6 sessions, 12 hours

Explore the world of the very small. Once thought to be the smallest of all particles, we find levels of details in protons and neutrons that we never dreamed could exist. Dark matter, black holes and other crazy stuff will challenge our very notions of reality. We will concentrate on the concepts rather than PhD level math. If you are willing to abandon preconceived notions of reality, these ideas start to make sense. Why is warped spacetime a better explanation of the phenomenon we call gravity than that of Newton? Come and discuss.

Instructor: Bob Rubock graduated with a BS in Electrical Engineering from Rensselaer and an MSEE from the University of Connecticut. He began his career in electronic warfare at United Aircraft but eventually turned to design of spacecraft for humanitarian purposes at NASA. Bob likes to say; "Engineering made the dough, Cosmology makes me go." His courses require no math or formal scientific training, but a good sense of humor is mandatory. Bob believes that starting a class with good jokes improves the learning process. Bob's other passion is rock climbing, having traveled around the U.S. and Europe in its pursuit.

ILR564 Federalism: Limitations on Federal Power Which Protect the People and the States: The Tenth Amendment

6 sessions, 9 hours

This course considers the uniquely American approach to the balance between the power of the Federal government and the governments of the respective States. This balance is dictated by the provisions of the Tenth Amendment to the Constitution which provides "The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the States are reserved to the States respectively, or to the people." We will consider the historical, sociological and political reasons surrounding the inclusion of the Tenth Amendment in the Bill of Rights and its application over time. We will also consider the division of authority between the federal government and the States, and whether the federal government may adequately address the needs of the people, is the concept of State's rights a basic truth, and the role of the judiciary in balancing the powers granted to the federal government and the States.

From the middle ages and the arrival of the monastic systems to the literature and paintings of the early Renaissance period, students in this class will examine events, movements, and historical figures of the medieval period. Every day life in the peasantry and the nobility will be reviewed.

Instructor: Dr. Lois Jarman has been a world language educator for more than seventeen years. She has taught English, French, Spanish, and Latin on a secondary and post-secondary level. Lois received her doctoral degree in second language acquisition and currently is the Director of the Intensive English Language Program at Shepherd University. 
